The SEND Team



The SEND Team is responsible for coordinating and managing the statutory education, health and care (EHC) needs assessment process; issuing, maintaining and reviewing EHC Plans and securing and monitoring appropriate educational placements and provision for children and young people with complex special educational needs and disabilities (aged 0 – 25), in accordance with relevant legislation and the SEN Code of Practice.

The SENCO (Special Educational Needs Coordinator) or Inclusion Manager at your child's educational setting is responsible for ensuring the needs of the pupils with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) are met at school. If you contact your child's school and ask for the SENCO they will make sure you speak to the right person.

Portsmouth SEND Information Advice and Support Service



Portsmouth SEND Information Advice and Support Service (IASS) is a service available to Portsmouth parents/carers of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities between 0 – 25 years. Young people (16 – 25) who have special educational needs and disabilities can receive support from our young person's SEND IASS Adviser.

We can give impartial, confidential information and advice on what happens during the preparation of an EHC plan. We can support parents to give their views during the assessment, to prepare for meetings, to review the draft plan, look at ways to overcome disagreement and to signpost to other services.
